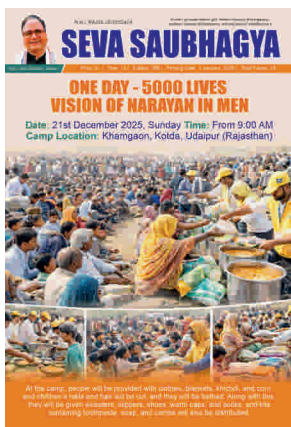

World of Humanity Realised

Scriptures also say that "service is the greatest dharma, and a person's welfare comes through charity." This spirit has been truly embodied by the donors supporting Narayan Seva Sansthan.

In the forty-year service journey of the organisation, they have helped millions of differently-abled individuals stand on their own feet, provided state-of-the-art prosthetic limbs to those who lost hands or legs in accidents, connected the differently-abled and underprivileged to employment through skill development training, and arranged over 2,510 marriages, giving them a joyful marital life. To make service to the underprivileged sections of society more dynamic, organised, and multidimensional, these generous donors inaugurated the "World of Humanity" through the organisation on 7th December—heartfelt gratitude to all these compassionate donors and philanthropists. The Sansthan family bows deeply before their dedication and spirit of service. This is not just a multi-storey building but a symbol of compassion, dedication, and a sense of duty, which will inspire future generations to walk the path of service. The construction of the "World of Humanity" began on 8th February 2020 at Mali Colony in the heart of the city, with a foundation-laying ceremony performed by the esteemed Gurudev Shri Kailash Ji 'Manav' and Guru Mata Shrimati Kamla Devi Ji, with support from donors and collaborators from across the country. Soon after, the entire world came under the dark shadow of COVID-19, yet the

commitment to service continued relentlessly, because the goal was not merely constructing a building but bringing happiness and transformation into the lives of those in need. Today, with the blessings of God, the prayers of the needy, and the support of donors, this 11-storey building, spanning 240,000 square feet, has been inaugurated as a 450-bed hospital for the differently-abled. The entire complex is fully air-conditioned and equipped with state-of-the-art medical facilities. The newly constructed "World of Humanity" houses two modern operating theaters employing advanced techniques for orthopaedic, polio, clubfoot, and other surgeries. It has a cutting-edge physiotherapy and rehabilitation center, where each beneficiary receives a personalized rehabilitation plan. A center for the production of artificial limbs and orthotic devices ensures high-quality equipment is made and provided on-site. There is a self-employment training centre offering skills such as mobile repair, computer training, fashion design, tailoring, and mechanical skills. A residential school for specially-abled children provides integrated education, nutrition, medical care, and psychological support. The most important and proud fact is that all these services will remain completely free. The founder-chairman of the organization and my revered father, Gurudev Shri Kailash Ji 'Manav', says: "I have witnessed the struggles of the differently-abled very closely. When a person cannot walk, speak, or perform daily activities, the pain is not only physical; it resonates in their soul. Service is not charity; it is duty. Here, service is offered with equality and respect, not pity." These words reflect not only sentiment but the essence of four decades of dedicated service. The "World of Humanity" is a manifestation of the tireless devotion of Shri Kailash Ji 'Manav' and Guru Mata Shrimati Kamla Devi Ji. "This building is not just a medical center; it is a gateway of opportunities where every suffering individual will leave with the belief that they are capable, competent, and can rebuild their life. Our objective is to make differently-abled individuals partners in society, not a burden. Heartfelt salutations to the donors, the laborers, technicians, and devotees who worked day and night on this construction. Congratulations."

Sudhanshu's Tiny Steps Moved Forward for the First Time

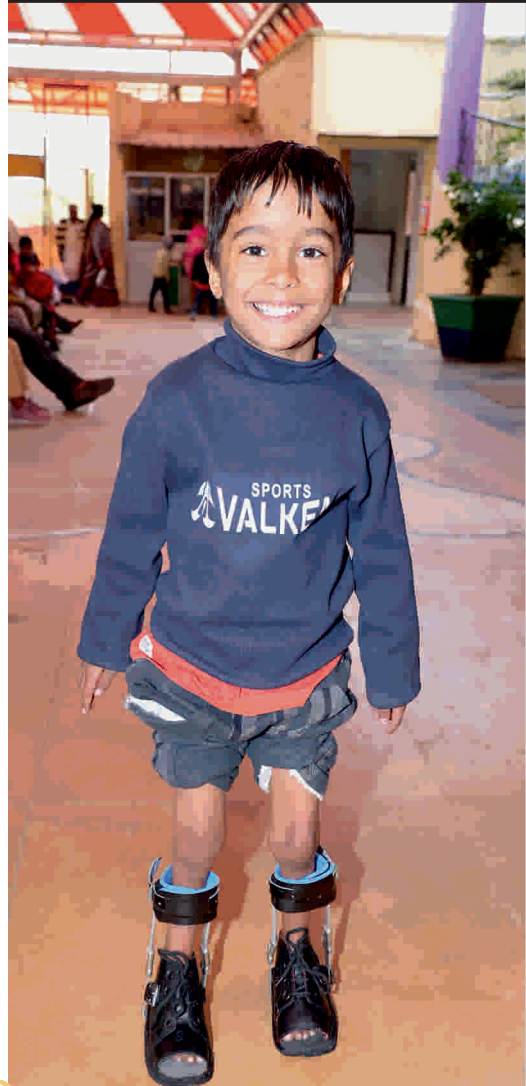
Sudhanshu Kumar (6), from Kataiya village in the Sitamarhi district of Bihar, was born with both feet and the thumbs of his hands bent—medically known as clubfoot. The innocent eyes that should have held dreams of walking, running, and playing were instead frozen in pain. Because of this disability, tears often flowed from his eyes. The deformity in his feet prevented him from moving forward, and the deformity in his hands stopped him from even holding toys.

Despite his poor financial condition, his father, Pankaj Jha, was deeply worried about his son's treatment. Even if it meant taking loans, he wanted to free his child from this intense suffering. But a solution seemed beyond his reach. While village children played and ran around, Sudhanshu would quietly watch them through the window. In his tender mind, there was only one heavy question: “Will I ever be able to do that too?”

Amid these hopes, one day his father learned through social media about the free treatment provided by Narayan Seva Sansthan. For him, this information felt like a message from God. Without delay, he brought Sudhanshu to Udaipur. Sudhanshu's treatment began with patience and sensitivity. Over the past five months, he underwent several examinations and two major surgeries. The operation was performed on 4th October, and he was discharged on 12th October 2025.

The doctors' hard work and the parents' prayers bore fruit—the surgery was successful. On 12th November 2025, during a follow-up, when Sudhanshu was fitted with special shoes and calipers, he carefully stood up, then slowly moved forward, and finally, for the first time, walked without support. The glow on his face, the smile on his lips, and the tears welling up in his parents' eyes were beyond words.

Today, Sudhanshu is not only walking, but with every step, he is feeling new waves of confidence. He says, “Now I will also run and move forward.” His father, overwhelmed with emotion, says only this: “Narayan Seva Sansthan does not just provide treatment; it fills lives with hope. My family will always remain indebted to the organization and its donors.” The organization has not only helped the child stand on his feet but has also lifted the entire family out of despair.





Neha Became Self-Reliant Through Skill Training

Neha Kumari, a 22-year-old from the Vaishali district of Bihar, was born with one leg that was only partially developed. This congenital physical disability made her life challenging. Despite difficulties in standing and moving around, she never allowed herself to feel weak. With the encouragement of her family and her own determination, she completed her education, but the journey toward self-reliance was still incomplete.

During this time, she came to know about Narayan Seva Sansthan. After examining her condition, the doctors at the organisation prepared special calipers for her underdeveloped leg, enabling Neha to now walk comfortably. She shares that coming to the organisation has been a very pleasant and motivating experience for her life. At the organization, she also received the opportunity for computer training, which included subjects such as MS Office, internet usage, typing, and digital communication. Through this training, she achieved the goal of self-reliance.

Neha says, “The organization helped me stand on my own feet. I have gained the confidence to do something on my own.” Today, she is completely positive about her future.

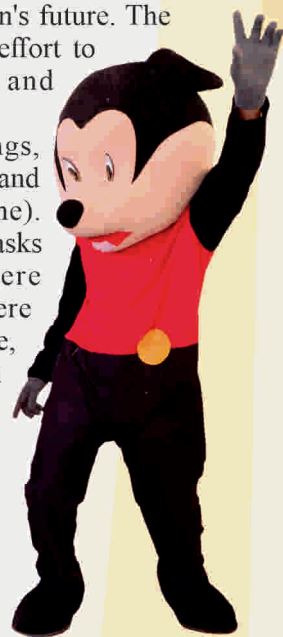


NCA celebrated Children's Day with differently-abled children.

During the celebration, the academy children dressed up as police officers, lawyers, soldiers, and doctors. As soon as Kailash Ji asked a question, the patient became emotionally overwhelmed, and tears welled up in his eyes. Kailash Ji was startled, wondering what he had said to hurt the patient so deeply. Before he could speak, the patient, with a choked voice, said, “My son and nephew are sitting outside. We don't even have money to buy poison. I have kept these two rotis for them. I ate one, and the other one – both uncle and nephew will eat. I have been doing this for the last three days. I am very hungry, I can't sleep at night, but what can I do? Here, food is given in fixed portions, and we manage with that only.”

Now tears welled up in Kailash Ji's eyes. The patient's words tore his heart apart as if someone had stabbed it. Kailash Ji, deeply pained and unsure of what to do, looked at the patient without blinking. Then the patient took out a torn piece of paper from his pocket and placed it in front of him, saying, “Doctor, these medicines were prescribed to me, but where will I get them from?”

Kailash Ji consoled him, saying he would help, and asked him to eat the two rotis in the bowl. He took the prescription from the patient and gathered information about his brother and son, then went outside. He located them, took them to a hotel in front of the hospital, and fed them. After that, he purchased the medicines according to the prescription and returned them to the patient. When he told the patient that his brother and nephew had been fed, the patient folded his hands and began to cry. Kailash Ji comforted him and promised that he would take full care of them all.

That night, a handful of flour kept Kailash Ji awake. The pitiful face of the poor patient kept appearing before him repeatedly. He thought about how many people like this must exist, and whom he could help. Even if he helped, it could only be 4–5 people at most, as that was all he could manage. Thoughts came and went. The next day was Dussehra, and a Yagna was scheduled. His chain of thoughts wandered until he fell asleep without realising it. The Yagna was held in Sector 5. Kailash Ji and his companions had established the Gayatri Charanpeeth and organised Yagnas under its guidance. On that day, the Yagna was held on the roadside so that maximum people could participate. Kailash Ji was conducting the Yagna, but thoughts of the impoverished patient dominated his mind.

When the time for Dev Dakshina came at the end of the Yagna, Kailash Ji requested, “For the service of poor Narayan, I would like one handful of flour from each of you as Dakshina.”
